 - d. Roberts Family + Mutual Assistance Network



- III. Biggest issues: housing, transportation, mental health, lack of knowledge about BCLC and services, employment opportunities for youth, youth mentorship + programs, prenatal care and teen pregnancy (Del Paso Heights in particular), educating the community on public health, outreach

- I. 7 current CIL sites (data from 2021)
- II. Narrowed down to two for possible 8th site (95670- Rancho Cordova, 95608-Carmichael)
- III. Conclusions of presentation
 - a. Current focus areas are good, but zip codes both inside and outside of current range could benefit from a CIL site
 - b. In order to become a CIL site, area needs an established organization willing to take on the role

 - a. Many people have to travel to sites from outside zip codes to get resources
 - b. Need result/plan solidified by first quarter of 2025

 - a. Need more outlier pockets, should consider using a mobile unit that supports the work for the top zip code
